1	the videos. So this is my second round of taking this class. The professors are copy and pasting the same videos across the courses. Verbatim the same videos from my almost failed last semester. It would be nice to see actual ASU staff teaching this class. For every section in this course Youtube was my goto in order to understand and see examples of the content.	
2	accents of the teachers are sometimes difficult to understand and some things on the homework are not in the included lecture videos so often times, I have to google to learn how to do something instead, or the lecture videos aren't very well laid out/organized	
3	There was confusion over grades with their import into canvas being incorrectly done. Honorlock does not aid performance but rather hinders it as it can be a source of anxiety which is cognitively tasking. There was not much for practice resources just the book and homework.	
4	There was no engagement. Announcements were copied and pasted from previous ones.	
5	The videos are years old, and sometimes don't help at all with the homework. The course needs to ditch WebWork and find something that helps with learning. The professor notified us over halfway through the course that an "accidental" curve was being applied to our tests making all of us feel like we were doing a lot better in the class than we were. I understand mistakes happen but the professor and TA's need to pay better attention to those details, we pay thousands of dollars for this class things like that shouldn't happen.	
6	The video lectures are not good. I spent more time watching organic chemistry teacher on youtube. The problem isn't the presenters understanding of the material - but 2 of the 3 lecturers have a hard time finding the English words. I commend the ability to speak multiple languages, but while delivering high-level, complex content like Calculus - it is nearly impossible to follow along with broken English and poor instructor "flow"	
7	The test grade structure was horrible. I had my grade switched halfway through the session because the instructor screwed up and now i don't believe i will pass.	
8	The professor's communication skills are lacking. While he claims to be magnanimous, he was leaving a curve on our grades and suddenly, took it away halfway through the semester.	
9	The lecture videos. The woman that gives them has such a thick accent that it is terribly difficult to understand and follow what she is saying. Before I went to the old videos I watched the same video 4 times and only understood a little bit of it.	
10	One HUGE issue I have with this course is that the weights for the exams were wrong for almost TWO MONTHS. I went into the second exam thinking I had a 108% in the class, which turned out to be a false sense of security. The professor had the exams weighted out of 70 points, then swapped it to 100 three days after the second exam, which was in April. I felt cheated and my grade dropped 18% just on that change... I get mistakes can happen, but how can something so important be wrong for so long? It's pure negligence and lack of attention to detail.	
11	Oh where to begin. I'm not sure why we had a professor because I taught myself with the help of Inscribe. This course really reminded me of the SATs. You are given resources and told to prepare for the test. I learned more outside of the material given than I did with what I was given in Canvas. Not everyone is able to learn based on reading concepts, and actually need examples of how/why a problem works. There were examples, but more often than not, there wasn't for hw problems. It would have been nice to have some assignments or discussions, that further taught harder concepts. The amount of testing is insane. Taking two exams within 5 days of each other is rough. How about combining the last two exams? Or get rid of one? If it's that necessary to have to measure knowledge, throw in a quiz instead. Last, but not least, the timing on the test. If it's known that a test is harder or there is more calculations involved, why would there not be more time added to take the test?	
12	Not all problems are covered by lecture videos and example problem videos. Need more example videos.	

13	In the InScribe website used, I would get emails from students in other courses.	
14	In Canvas, some lessons are out of order and not easy to catch so it's easy to do lessons out of order, which can be frustrating on lessons that require previous knowledge you haven't been exposed to. I recommend the order be revised.

18	<p>1) Professor England was not good. The perception I got of his teaching style was that he is very hands-off and laid back.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - He let wrong grades sit in Canvas for months but the students didn't know they were wrong. Then he blamed that issue on someone else. - He is not responsive to emails when there are issues on test days. He is very clear that email is the appropriate method to contact him, and that test days he is available to help. It takes him 12 hours to respond on test days. - He entered wrong due dates in WebWork which made one of the exams open about 10-12 hours later than he told us it would. This can be particularly problematic for online students with the proctoring requirements. <p>2) WebWork is terrible. Do not let the professors use it. Use ALEKS instead. We were told by Professor England that WebWork is cheaper than other platforms and saves students money which is why he uses it. Except I now have to buy a \$200 book that would normally be included in ALEKS. I would rather pay \$85 for ALEKS access which has everything I need and gives me a better idea of where I am at with my progress.</p> <p>3) Stop using Honorlock or any proctoring programs like it. It's way too intrusive and it doesn't work. These proctoring programs are a major invasion of privacy and a quick Google search shows how easily they can be defeated. There should be no requirement that I show you the inside of my home, hotel room, apartment, etc in order to take a test. Stop using this stuff. Find another way to test our abilities that don't require these things. Or, crazy thought, let us use notes. Asking an engineer to design a structure with no notes/resources is asking for there to be issues with that structure. If you want to prepare us for the real world, treat us like adults and let us use the resources that would be available in the real world.</p>

Students were misled on the date of exams - the instructor changed the date on the syllabus the DAY OF AN EXAM. When asked why - because he "made a mistake" and now we are forced to take it on Easter Sunday? The syllabus stated for the duration of the semester that this exam was on Monday the 18th, but on Sunday the 17th the instructor changed the date on the syllabus and said "I always schedule tests on Sundays". This is unacceptable. The syllabus is contract between student and teacher and this teacher blatantly disregards that. Also - the instructor made another "mistake" on grades and misled students to believe their grade was over 15% higher than actual. This mistake was allowed to go on for MORE THAN HALF THE SEMESTER. It wasn't until after the drop deadline that the professor fixed this mistake.....another unacceptable "mistake" from a poorly coordinated online course. These online courses don't require much interaction from the professor, but we ask to AT LEAST be given accurate information to work on our own - this teacher is working against us.
